




On-time Placement Performance




Country Diversification (Pax Mos Sending)



Organizational Structure



Market Environment

Market Trends and Forecasts

Inbound mobility is dominated by the full fee-paying market (i.e., international students paying tuition and host family fees in full). For outbound mobility, there is a growing trend towards schools organizing their own group programs or study tours. There are options for AFS to position itself as a service provider to this market. Because of increasingly strict regulatory environments within Australia (at the state/territory level), AUS does not see opportunity for significant growth in AFS' traditional programs (YP/SM).
